Conference Reports

308th Meeting, Classification Research Group

This meeting was held on Friday February 21, 1997 at the University College London. The meeting opened with a discussion on alphabetical indexes to classification schedules particularly to the indexes of the BC2 fascicules that have been published. At the meeting three sample index excerpts were examined, with the assistance from the BCA computer programs of the unfinalized classification schedules of BC2 Class U/V Technology. Other topics raised at the meeting included the style variations between one published fascicule index and another, problems in creating a satisfactory index to the whole BC2 system, and recommendations that a revised or new INDEX program should meet the specifications of an agreed indexing policy. The attendees also raised concerns about questionable results in existing published indexes.
