One the strengths of this meeting was a fruitful interdisciplinary exchange of ideas between the about 60 participating experts (with backgrounds in product design, history, or forensic medicine, etc.). It turned out that the focus on "Knowledge Organization and Edutainment" was well chosen to stimulate a discussion about the relationship between the foundations of knowledge organization and the challenges we face with new non-scientific environments and technologies. The conference will be accompanied by a strategic planning session on the direction and future of this chapter, and of knowledge organization in general. It is expected that this workshop will inspire and revitalize the German ISKO chapter.

It is further planned that the next conference of ISKO's German chapter will take place in 2002 in Regensburg, in close cooperation with the International Symposium for Information Science. A date for the conference has not yet been set.
